> Tips in maximising performance when treating Broadleaf Weeds

- > Apply to actively growing weeds.
- > Transient discolouration may occur on Kikuyu, Carpetgrass & Qld Blue Couch.
- > Varietal differences in certain buffalo grasses (eg. ST85) may produce more pronounced effects and it is recommended that small areas be tested for turf safety before large scale application occurs.
- > Use a surfactant for difficult to wet weeds.
- > Do not use on bentgrass or wintergrass golf and bowling greens.
- > Do not use clippings as mulch around other plants or for composting.
- > Do not apply if rain is expected within 4 hours.
- > Do not apply if weeds or turf are under stress or when frosts are imminent.
- Shake container well before use.

Seeds: Woolly.



Flower Colour: Forms burrs with short, sharp spines. Foliage: Leaves are finely divided. A small rosette forming annual, principally a weed of turf familiar to many bare footed children.






Hypochoeris radicata

Flower Colour: Golden Yellow Foliage: Leaves greater than 5cm long, generally hairless. A perennial plant, common weed in lawns, gardens and roadsides in all states.

Cudweed

Creeping Oxalis

Family: Asteraceae




Foliage: Leaves succulent, deeply lobed. A flat,

stemless sprawling annual weed. Difficult to control

Capeweed

Family: Oxalidaceae Oxalis corniculata

Gnaphalium spp Flower Colour: Bright Yellow with 5 petals. Foliage: Leaves in thress, heart shaped & pale green.



Flower Colour: Green with a Red or Purple tinge. Foliage: Spoon shaped leaves, woolly on both surfaces. Annual plant, common throughout coastal NSW and Qld.

Prolific seed producing, perennial plant. Plantain



Flower Colour: White, sometimes with tinge of pink. Foliage: Leaves, long & narrow and pointed with deep veins. Roots: Strong taproot. Perennial rosette reproducing from seed. Mowers often miss seedheads



Flower Colour: White, sometimes with tinge of pink. Foliage: Leaves have three leaflets with white watermarks. Perennial legume is common in nitrogen deficient turf and areas with excess moisture
